

3 year Clinical Research Training Fellowships in Translational Medicine

The partnership between Cambridge University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust and University of Cambridge has been awarded a National Institute for Health Research Biomedical Research Centre, and plans to appoint 2 research fellowships in translational medicine for candidates who wish to pursue a career in academic medicine. The research themes of the NIHR Cambridge Biomedical Research Centre are Cancer, Diabetes, Obesity and Metabolic disorders, Neuroscience, Transplantation, Cardiovascular Medicine, Infection and Immunity, Genetics, Women's Health, Musculoskeletal Disorders and Imaging.

This exciting new scheme will include fellowships that involve collaboration between Clinical Departments covering these themes, the Institute of Public Health and University of Cambridge Faculties of Biological Sciences and Physical Sciences, including Departments of Biochemistry, Chemistry, Genetics, Pathology, Physics, Engineering and Material Sciences, and the Gurdon Institute.

Successful applicants will be post FY2, will be expected to register for a PhD with the University of Cambridge and must be in post by July 2009.
