These Research Ethics Study Days are designed to help investigators complete documentation properly, produce appropriate patient information sheets, explore ethical issues raised by controversial research and anticipate the ethical concerns that members of Research Ethics Committees (REC) are likely to have about proposed research methodology.

Participants will learn from expert REC members about the process of ethical review through a combination of presentations, group work and question & answer sessions.

Attendance at the course will also provide an opportunity to discuss the online Research Ethics Committees (NRES) application form and any specific problems you may have with your research.
